#### 1.0 INTRODUCTION TO UNIVERSITI MALAYSIA SARAWAK (UNIMAS)

#### 1.1 UNIMAS Vision

The University's vision is to be a leading global university for a sustainable future.

#### 1.2 UNIMAS Mission

The University's mission is to enhance the social and economic impacts on the global community through the pursuit of excellence in teaching, research, and strategic engagement.

#### 1.3 Brief History of UNIMAS

Universiti Malaysia Sarawak (UNIMAS) was officially incorporated on 24 December 1992. UNIMAS is the eighth public Malaysian university, established just after the declaration of Vision 2020. The challenges outlined to achieve this Vision have given UNIMAS the unique opportunity not simply to respond to change but to become a significant agent and intellectual catalyst of change nationally.

The University took in its pioneer students numbering 118 in 1993 with the opening of the Faculty of Social Sciences and Faculty of Resource Science and Technology. In 1994, the University moved to its temporary campus in Kota Samarahan. The University's temporary campus at Kota Samarahan was officially launched by Prime Minister, YAB Tun Dr. Mahathir Mohamad on Merdeka Day, 31 August 1993.

Over the years, the University has developed rapidly with the establishment of nine faculties, nine research centres, five research institutes with a total of 42 undergraduates and 40 Postgraduate Programs offered. UNIMAS is a university committed to being contemporary in character and forward looking in outlook in developing its education system. Since its inception in 1992, UNIMAS has been dedicated to educating students who are not only highly knowledgeable and skilled in their respective fields, but also individuals who are well-rounded, practical as well as rich in culture and positive values. #### 3.1.3 Philosophy

The UNIMAS Nursing Programme is committed to excel in nursing education, research and practice. It views health as complex and dynamic, and the client as a holistic individual. Students in this programme learn in an environment that stimulates intellectual inquiry and creativity which encourages them to be problem-solvers and lifelong learners.

# 3.2 The Bachelor of Nursing with Honours Programme

The Bachelor of Nursing with Honours Programme has been designed to:

- Enable pre-registration nursing students to acquire a sound knowledge and skills for beginning professional nursing practice and post-registration students to strengthen and broaden their knowledge of nursing and its related and supporting disciplines.
- Provide an appropriate educational foundation from which successful students may proceed to post-graduate studies in nursing.

In keeping with the educational aim of UNIMAS to provide education for capability, the nursing program values creativity in developing human potential and encourages its students to be both critical thinkers and independent learners. In order to promote the achievement of these attributes, students are expected to be active participants in the teaching-learning process through their involvement in all of the program's educational activities, e.g., lectures, discussions, seminars, clinical sessions, presentations, problem-based learning sessions, as well as independent or self-directed learning.

Underpinning the programme is the faculty's commitment to the concept of holistic health care. As a basis for the application of this concept to professional nursing practice, a core curriculum has been evolved which consists of five inter-woven strands namely basic medical sciences, nursing sciences and clinical nursing, humanities, social sciences with ICT and entrepreneurial skills incorporated in all components. # 3.5 Facilities available within the Faculty

#### 4.0 MINIMUM ENTRY REQUIREMENT FOR BACHELOR OF NURSING WITH HONOURS

#### FOR MALAYSIAN CANDIDATES:

## **Either one** of the following below:

- Pass in Sijil Tinggi Pelajaran Malaysia (STPM) or \*equivalent with minimum CGPA 2.5;
- Pass Matriculation/Foundation with minimum CGPA 2.5;
- Pass 'A' level minimum Grade C in three(3) other subjects;
- Pass any Diploma with minimum CGPA
   2.5 (no credit transfer); equivalent MQF
   Level 4.
- Pass Diploma in Nursing from a recognized institution by MNB with minimum two (2) years clinical working experience (credit transfer allowed).
  - Registered with Malaysian Nursing Board.
  - Possess a current annual practicing certificate.

### AND

All candidates who possess STPM 'A' Level, Matriculation/Foundation and pass any Diploma except Diploma in Nursing **MUST** possess:

#### Either one of the credit below:

 Science/Biology/Chemistry/Physics/ Applied Science at SPM or its equivalent.

#### **AND**

 Credit in Mathematics (Elementary or Additional or Modern) at SPM or its equivalent.

#### AND

 MUET with minimum Band 3 / IELTS with minimum of 5.5/ TOEFL with a minimum score of 515/215/80/ credit in English SPM.

#### 6.0 ACADEMIC MATTERS

#### **6.1** Categories of Courses

#### 6.1.1 Core Courses

are compulsory courses for students in a programme. The core courses comprise of courses in the basic medical sciences, nursing sciences and clinical nursing, humanities, scientific methods and electives with ICT and entrepreneurial skills incorporated in all components. The programme's design not only takes into account the core knowledge and clinical skill requirements necessary for safe professional practice in a variety of Malaysian nursing environments, but also attempts to incorporate relevant aspects of international educational practice.

#### 6.1.2 Elective Courses

are offered by the other faculties, which all undergraduate students must complete in addition to their core courses. Each student must successfully complete **3 credits** of elective course prior to graduation (refer to course structure for further details).

## **6.1.3** Generic Development Courses

are common courses of the university that aim to develop the mind, attitude and personality among students. Each student must successfully complete a minimum of **6 credits** of generic courses before they are allowed to graduate. (refer to course structure for further details).

## 6.1.4 General Studies Subjects (Mata Pelajaran Pengajian Umum / MPU)

are compulsory university courses to be taken in order to meet the graduation requirements. Each student must successfully complete a minimum of **10 credits** of MPU courses before they are allowed to graduate. Courses under the MPU category are seen able to produce holistic graduates, who appreciate the values of patriotism and the Malaysian identity, and master the soft skills towards fulfilling work marketability (refer to course structure for further details).

## 6.1.5 Remedial Course (Kursus Pengukuhan)

is a basic course by Student Development Centre that aims to improve the understanding and mastery of students in a field. Each student must successfully complete a minimum of **1 credit** of remedial course (PPD1041 Softskills) before they are allowed to graduate (refer to course structure for further details).

#### 6.2 Advanced Credit

Post-registration students are allowed to apply for credit transfer. It is awarded to students if they can provide evidence that they have obtained a good pass in relevant subjects from their former institutions and relevant experience, knowledge and expertise in a clinical specialty recognized by the University. Students can apply to the Faculty for advanced credits.

Applications will be considered individually based on the following criteria:

- Have obtained at least an equivalent (and above) of grade B in the courses they are applying for advanced credits.
- Have the relevant experience, knowledge and expertise which are recognized by the University as equivalent to the requisite above.
- The relevant courses or knowledge, experience and expertise should have been obtained by students within the last three years.
- The total advanced credits granted to students should not exceed 30% of the total program course credits.

Note: Credit transfer for cohort 2022/2023 - to refer to section 10.2.0.

#### 6.3 Attendance

Attendance at all scheduled lectures, tutorials, laboratory sessions, presentations, practical classes and clinical sessions (whether in the Clinical Skill Development Laboratory or in Hospital or Health Care setting) is **COMPULSORY**.

- (a) Lecture hours (all classes for non-clinical placement courses) at least 85% of attendance
- (b) Clinical practice placement 100% of attendance (no absence allowed without genuine / approved reasons)

In the event of an absence due to sickness, a Medical Certificate must be submitted to the relevant Course Coordinator to be submitted to the academic office for record.

- (a) Medical leave should **not exceed 9 days per year** and only valid for non-clinical placement courses.
- (b) Medical leave for **clinical placement courses MUST be replaced** according to LJM criteria.

Failure to attend scheduled sessions in the absence of a genuine reason may result in a student being and/or either:

- (a) referred for disciplinary action;
- (b) barred from taking the end of semester examination in any course;and/or
- (c) given a 'Fail' grade in any course.

#### 6.4 Deferment of Studies

## 6.4.1 Consideration for the Deferment of Registration

A student who is sick for an extended period can apply to the Dean of the Faculty to defer his/her registration. For all such cases, an appropriate verification from a registered medical doctor is required. In special cases where the verification is not from a registered medical doctor, application for postponement of registration can only be considered if the student has initially sought medical treatment. In psychiatric cases, approval for course re-registration will be subjected to the recommendation of the doctor involved.

The medical doctors who provide treatment and verification for students must be from the Ministry of Health, the University or from the University's panel of doctors. All decisions relating to such applications are made at the Faculty level.

## 6.4.2 Consideration for the deferment of sitting for examination

A student who is sick or faces other serious problems during the examination period must apply to the Dean of the Faculty to defer his/her sitting for the examination. However, any application for a deferment must be made within 48 hours of the examination.

Any application to defer the sitting of any examinations on medical grounds must be made with verification from the registered medical doctor who is treating the student. The attending doctor must be from the Ministry of Health, the University or from the University's panel of doctors.

### 6.5 Duration of Studies

#### **6.5.1** Pre-Registration Programme

The duration for pre-registration programme requires a minimum of four (4) years of full-time study.

#### 6.5.2 Post-Registration students with credit transfer

The duration of study for post-registration students with credit transfer requires a minimum of two and half (2½) years duration of study.

#### 7.0 SUBMISSION OF ASSIGNMENT AND PLAGIARISM

# 7.1 Guidelines / Reminders for Submission of Assignment <u>BEFORE handing in your</u> assignments

- 1. Check that you have met all of the General Presentation guidelines set out above.
- 2. **PHOTOCOPY your assignment** You must make a photocopy of your assignment you prepare in case this is required for re-assessment or to replace an original, which may have gone astray.

## **Handing in your assignments**

- 1. All assignments are to be handed in by/before the due date.
- 2. Assignments must be handed in either to the Course Coordinator concerned or to other lecturers specifically assigned by the Course Coordinator.

If you have handed in your assignment to an "assigned" lecturer, it is your responsibility to check with the Course Coordinator that your assignment has been received.

#### Extension of time to complete assignments

Assignments which are handed in beyond the due date may incur a penalty. However, extensions beyond the due date may be granted in extenuating circumstances. Special consideration may be given for health problems, compassionate reasons and other extenuating circumstances.

Students who wish to apply for an extension must do so personally from the Course Coordinator concerned. *This should be done prior to the due date*.

You are strongly advised to apply for an extension if there are genuine reasons why you cannot meet the due date specified for submission; do not risk incurring the penalty for late submission.

#### Penalties for late submission of assignments

The penalties below apply to all assignments hand in late, unless otherwise stipulated by the Course Coordinator concerned. The penalty will be deducted from the mark the assignment would have received had it not been late. Penalties are calculated as a percentage of the total marks available for the assignment as follows:

1 to 3 days	10%
4 to 7 days	20%
More than 1 week but less than 2 weeks	50%
More than 2 weeks	100%

For example: The total value of the assignment is marked and is scored at 15 out of 20 marks. It then incurs a penalty of minus 2 (10% of 20). The 2 marks are deducted from the marks of 15, giving a final score of 13 out of 20.

# 7.2 Plagiarism

Plagiarism is generally defined as the deliberate incorporation in an essay or paper of material drawn from the work of another person without proper acknowledgement. Paraphrasing without a citation is plagiarism.

All students enrolled in the Bachelor of Nursing with Honours programme will be issued with a Referencing Guide to assist them to acknowledge, in an academically appropriate way, all materials drawn from the work of other people (e.g. Provide a citation, either in the text or in a footnote, and either enclose their words inside quotation marks or put their words in a block of indented, single paced text).

The University, the Faculty and the Nursing Department view plagiarism very seriously. **Plagiarism is an academic offence**; it is also a legal issue. Any student who is found to have plagiarized will be severely penalized (for example, being barred from sitting for examinations, having passing grades cancelled, etc.)

#### 8.0 ACADEMIC ADVISORS ONLINE SYSTEM

#### 8.1 Purpose

The purpose of the UNIMAS **ACADEMIC ADVISOR ONLINE SYSTEM** is to provide guidance to students on academic matters and to foster a close and constructive professional relationship between students and the staff of the Faculty. While all lecturers in the Faculty are potentially academic advisors to all students who seek their advice, each lecturer is assigned particular responsibility to a small group of students.

#### 8.2 Role of academic advisors are:

- a) Assist students to gain an understanding of the curriculum, the faculty's expectations of its students and the University's requirements (for example, in respect of its student course registration system);
- b) Provide advice and guidance to students regarding academic matters;
- c) Provide feedback and opportunities for reflective review following the release of end-of-semester results;
- d) Assist students in solving problems and, when necessary, refer them to an appropriate authority or resource person;
- e) Perform any other functions as required by the Faculty.

## 8.3 Responsibilities of students:

All students are required to meet with their academic advisors on a regular basis, to discuss their learning progress including any academic problems encountered.

Students are required to meet their appointed academic advisors at least once per semester before they can print out the examination slips.

## 8.4 Implementation of the system:

**Academic advisors** and allocated students are expected to meet on a regular basis, approximately <u>three to four times per year under normal circumstances</u>. Appointments for meetings are usually arranged online for a time suitable to both. Each meeting is recorded online. Extra meeting appointment will be made with students as necessary.

#### 9.0 STUDENT PERFORMANCE ASSESSMENT

#### 9.1 Continuous Assessment

Students' progress is continuously monitored throughout the programme and feedback regarding their performance will be provided on a regular basis. In most courses, specified percentages of the marks from written assignments, seminar presentations and mid-semester examination (or periodic formative assessments contribute to the final marks for the course. This system values and rewards students' learning efforts throughout the semester rather than concentrating only on the outcome of one final examination. In addition to the assessment of knowledge, understanding and psychomotor skills, continuous assessment also takes into account students' attitudes, self-discipline and on-going patterns of learning behavior.

#### 9.2 Final Assessment

In many courses, student's performances are assessed both continuously and by means of a final examination at the end of the semester.

Students are reminded to check the course assessment details for each semester's courses at the beginning of each semester. This information is set out in the course handbook. The relevant information is given to students at the beginning of each semester by the course coordinator.

# 9.3 Grading System

Unlike the other programmes in UNIMAS, the Bachelor of Nursing with Honours Programme has its exclusive grading system based on the Malaysian Nursing Board Standard Operating Procedure Guideline.

Upon approval from the faculty, the student can request for a credit transfer for the programme with the requirements of:

- 10.2.1 Vertical credit transfer policy [from Diploma (MQF Level 4) to Bachelor (MQF Level 6)] Programme is subject to course-to-course mapping and general credit transfer requirements as per listed below:
- 10.2.1 (a) Credit transfer allowed from Diploma (MQF Level 4) to Bachelor (MQF Level 6) Program should not exceed 30% of the total graduating credit for the programme.
  - i. Passed with minimum of Grade C from previous institution/ programme that had been accredited (including Temporary Accreditation) / approved from the authorized body in the country.
  - ii. Transferred course credit must equivalent to the course credit offered by the Programme
  - iii. Allowed for courses with curriculum equality at least 80%
- 10.2.1 (b) Credit transfer allowed from Diploma (MQF Level 4) to Bachelor (MQF Level 6) Programme **should not exceed 50%** of the total graduating credit for the program as according to the regulation below:

#### 11.0 GENERIC & ELECTIVE COURSES

#### 11.1 Generic Courses

Courses under this category are designed to develop students with positive attitudes and culturally acceptable behaviour and personality traits. These courses also encourage the development of a balance between autonomy and cooperation, assertiveness and working independently, without direction from higher authorities, and the willingness to work as a team member in achieving common objectives.

Generic courses are compulsory for all undergraduates at UNIMAS. They are also referred to as the "University Core Courses" (*Kursus Teras Universiti*), which underscores the fact that they are **not trivial courses**. Certain Generic courses will require that the student meet the minimum level of competency. Those that do not meet with these pre-requisites are required to take Remedial Courses (*Kursus Pengukuhan*). The current minimum number of credits required for Generic courses is **6 credits**.

Transfer of credits may also be considered to a maximum of about a third of the total course credits for Generic Courses (i.e., up to 4 credits) provided that the student can supply evidence that he/she has previously attended similar courses with satisfactory results (i.e., at least the equivalent of grade B-) from institutions recognised by UNIMAS. Grades obtained in Generic courses are considered when calculating the student's CGPA. Refer to **Appendix A** for details on the courses offered under this category.

## 11.2 Elective Courses

Elective courses are additional courses, which all UNIMAS students must take. These courses are aimed at enabling students to acquire reasonable in-depth knowledge in fields other than that of their chosen field. Consequently, University Elective courses are more challenging compared to the Generic courses.

Even though UNIMAS students can choose to take any course that interests them, students at FMHS are only allowed to choose from sets of courses that have been endorsed by the faculty. This is because the programmes at FMHS use a calendar system that is different from those used by the rest of the university. In addition, the nature of the training involved in the preparation of FMHS

graduates makes it necessary that these courses are to be taken in an orderly and timely manner.

Students must complete a total of **3 credits**. Grades obtained In University Elective courses are considered when calculating the student's CGPA.

Refer to **Appendix** file for details on the courses offered under this category. Further details on the sets of endorsed courses will also be provided during the orientation session at FMHS or on the faculty notice boards.

#### 11.3 Remedial Courses ("Kursus Pengukuhan")

Students that do not meet with the minimal requirements for Generic courses are required to take the following courses:

PBI 1112	Preparatory English, Level I
PBI 1122	Preparatory English, Level II

The objective of this category of courses is to strengthen/increase the students' level of proficiency/competency. Students will only get a Pass (L) or Fail (F). These courses are not considered in CGPA calculations.

Refer to Appendix A (Table no. 1-3) for details on the courses offered under this category.

The criteria for assessing whether a student meets the minimal requirements for Remedial Courses are as follows:

#### 1) Malaysian University English Test (MUET)

All UNIMAS students who scored Band 1-2 in MUET will have to register for Preparatory English (Level 1) in Semester 1 of the new academic session.

Upon scoring a Pass (L) in Preparatory English (Level 1), the student must then register for Preparatory English (Level 2) in Semester 2

Those who scored Band 3-6 in MUET are allowed to skip the Preparatory English course and register for the English Generic courses.

#### Note:

If a student obtains Band 3-6 in another attempt at MUET, after entering UNIMAS, he/she can apply for an exemption from Preparatory English Level II, and advance to the English Generic courses.

All UNIMAS students are required to register and successfully complete the Preparatory English courses and/or two out of six Generic English courses during their studies at UNIMAS.

#### 11.4 Registration For Generic and Elective Courses

Prior to registration, students are to refer to the schedule provided for the list of courses for that particular semester. The number of credits for each semester has been pre-determined by the faculty. Registration for Generic and Elective courses is done at the beginning of a new semester. Students must pass all the courses listed. Otherwise, the course will have to be repeated until a passing grade is obtained.

#### 11.5 Rules and Regulations

All FMHS students are expected to:

- a) Take responsibility for meeting all the Generic and Elective courses' requirement.
- b) Inform the Academic office of any irregularities that may prevent them from graduating. This must be done at the earliest opportunity.

UNIMAS has adopted a formal policy about attendance at all scheduled teaching sessions (i.e. lectures, laboratory sessions, clinical sessions, tutorials and presentations). Students will be barred from sitting for the final examination of any courses concerned if he/she has failed to attend a minimum of 85% of the total scheduled teaching sessions.

If a student falls sick and cannot attend the scheduled teaching session, he/she is expected to inform the lecturer concerned at least an hour before the scheduled activity followed by submission of a medical certificate at the next scheduled session.

# THE PURCHASE OF AIR TICKETS WILL NOT BE ENTERTAINED AS VALID REASON FOR THE RESCHEDULING OF A PRESENTATION OR EXAMINATION.

Generic and Elective examinations are synchronized throughout the university and are scheduled as follows:

- a) Mid Semester Examination Week 7 or Week 8 of each semester.
- b) End of Semester Examination UNIMAS Examination Week, at the end of each semester as determined by course coordinator.

#### 11.6 Courses by Student Development Center (PPP)

#### 11.6.1 PPD1041 Softskills

It is a required course for all students, local and international, and a Pass is a requirement for graduation. It is a one (1) credit course. Students are to enroll this course in Semester 1 of Year 1 (please confirm with Faculty's appointed coordinator).

#### 11.6.2 Credited Co-curriculum Course

(MPUxxxx – course code depending on the selected module)
It is a required course for all students, local and international, and will be counted in CGPA for graduation. It is a two (2) credit course.
Students are to enroll this course in Semester 2 of Year 1.

#### 12.0 SEXUAL HARASSMENT CODE

Universiti Malaysia Sarawak (UNIMAS) has in place, procedures to deal with complaints about sexual harassment. - c) Visual e.g. showing pornographic materials, offensive images, drawing sex-based sketches or writing letters, sexual exposure;
- d) Psychological e.g. repeated unwanted social invitations, relentless proposals for dates and intimacy;
- e) Physical e.g. inappropriate behavior such as touching, patting, pinching, stroking, brushing up against someone, hugging, kissing, fondling, sexual assault.

The university takes the issues of victimisation very seriously. All enquiries and complaints are dealt with confidentially and impartially. If you are experiencing a problem which you think might be sexual harassment, contact your Academic Advisor / Head of Department / Programme Coordinator / Deputy Dean / Dean or any trusted staff / personnel in the university.
